

VOCABULARY FOR 2, JUNE 2018

1. CONTINENCE (NOUN): self-restraint

Synonyms: abstinence, chastity

Antonyms: wildness, intemperance

Example Sentence: Shivali hoped her continence would allow her to resist temptation.

2. PREROGATIVE (NOUN): privilege

Synonyms: perquisite, birthright

Antonyms: duty, obligation

Example Sentence: If you choose to follow your prerogative and behave badly, then the result will not be good for you.

3. SUFFICE (VERB): satisfy

Synonyms: content, fulfil

Antonyms: dissatisfy, displease

Example Sentence: Since I only have two dollars left in my pocket, this amount can't suffice my needs.

4. MIND-BOGGLING (ADJECTIVE): amazing

Synonyms: astonishing, startling

Antonyms: awful, appalling

Example Sentence: That piece of art involved the mind-boggling craft.

5. MOST INTELE (ADJECTIVE): theoretical

Synonyms: hypothetic, idealized

Antonyms: practical, realistic

Example Sentence: Ravita gave an example of the most intelle situation.

6. SCALLOP (VERB): crumple

Synonyms: pucker, rumple

Antonyms: flatten, smooth

Example Sentence: Amit scalloped the paper bag.

7. ABORT (VERB): halt

Synonyms: cut off, break off

Antonyms: begin, start

Example Sentence: The commander instructed them to abort the mission.

8. GLITCH (NOUN): error

Synonyms: flaw, malfunction

Antonyms: perfection, excellence

Example Sentence: The glitch in your computer system can be fixed easily.

9. BOUNTY (NOUN): gift

Synonyms: prize, reward

Antonyms: penalty, punishment

Example Sentence: She was given a bounty in her marriage.

10. KNUCKLE TO (VERB): abide by

Synonyms: adhere to, accede

Antonyms: disobey, dissuade

Example Sentence: The restaurant will be closed down soon if the owner does not knuckle to the sanitation.
