6. MONSTROUS (ADJECTIVE): (विकट/राक्षसी): shockingly devilish

7. MORPH (VERB): (रूप बदलना): to change into

Synonyms: transform, contort

Antonyms: sustain, stagnate

10. REVERENT (ADJECTIVE): (श्रद्धाल्): showing great respect.
