77. (A) Here from this structure, it seems that 'hat' is the 'subject' of sentence which is incorrect. Thus add 'while I was' before 'walking along the street'
78. (B) Given sentence is in 'Passive Voice', Thus replace 'cannot gathered' with 'cannot be gathered'.
79. (D) 'Between' is used for two person and 'among' is used for more than two.
80. (A) The word 'hanging around' means 'linger or wait'.
89. (A) 'Await' itself means 'to wait for'. It does not take preposition 'for' with it.
90. (B) According to the sentence the verb should be in active voice and in past perfect tense. Hence replace 'were prepared' with 'had prepared'.
91. (B) Subjunctive constructions do not need 'should'.
92. (D) The sentence and question tag must be in the same tense. Be careful while using 'pronoun'. Refer to Chapter 5 of **Volume-1**
