His younger child was afflicted with a skin disease.

2. MORATORIUM (NOUN): (प्रतिबंध): embargo**Synonyms:** ban, prohibition**Antonyms:** renewal**Example Sentence:**

There was a moratorium on the use of drift nets.

3. ENLIVEN (VERB): (हर्षित करना): cheer up**Synonyms:** raise someone's spirits, uplift**Antonyms:** subdue**Example Sentence:**

My visit to my mother had quite clearly enlivened her.

4. THRIVE (VERB): (फलना-फूलना): flourish**Synonyms:** prosper, burgeon**Antonyms:** fail, collapse**Example Sentence:**

The entertainment industry has thrived in the recent decade.

5. SUBVERSIVE (ADJECTIVE): (विनाशक): disruptive**Synonyms:** inflammatory, insurgent**Antonyms:** loyal**Example Sentence:**

He was seen as a potentially subversive man within the party.

6. CAPTIVATE (VERB): (मोह लेना): enthrall**Synonyms:** charm, enchant**Antonyms:** repel**Example Sentence:**

He was captivated by her beauty.

7. INCONCEIVABLE (ADJECTIVE): (समझ से बाहर): beyond belief**Synonyms:** unbelievable, incredible**Antonyms:** likely**Example Sentence:**

They behaved with inconceivable cruelty.

8. BUTTRESS (VERB): (समर्थन देना): strengthen**Synonyms:** reinforce, fortify**Antonyms:** weaken**Example Sentence:**

He buttressed his idea by religious belief.

9. PROMINENT (ADJECTIVE): (अगोचर): conspicuous**Synonyms:** noticeable, obvious**Antonyms:** inconspicuous**Example Sentence:**

The new housing estates are prominent landmarks.
