3. FORBEARANCE (NOUN):**(सहनशीलता): patient self-control****Synonyms:** tolerance, patience**Antonyms:** impatience**Example Sentence:**

His unflinching courtesy and forbearance under great provocation.

4. NASCENT (ADJECTIVE):**(नवजात): budding****Synonyms:** growing, developing**Antonyms:** developed, mature**Example Sentence:**
