2. ABDICATE (VERB): (पद को**त्यागना): disown****Synonyms:** turn down, spurn**Antonyms:** accept**Example Sentence:**

The government was accused of abdicating its responsibility.

3. ABROGATE (VERB): (अभिनिषेध**करना): repudiate****Synonyms:** revoke, repeal**Antonyms:** institute**Example Sentence:**

Engagements were binding, which ended up abrogating a particular engagement

4. STARK (ADJECTIVE): (दिखने या रूपरेखा**में गंभीर): severe in appearance****Synonyms:** sharp, crisp**Antonyms:** fuzzy**Example Sentence:**

The ridge formed a stark silhouette against the sky.

5. EXECUTIVE (ADJECTIVE):**(शासनात्मक): administrative****Synonyms:** decision-making, directorial**Antonyms:** subordinate**Example Sentence:**

An executive chairman was appointed.

6. RESTORE (VERB): (सुधारना): repair**Synonyms:** fix, mend**Antonyms:** neglect**Example Sentence:**

The building has been lovingly restored.

7. STREW (VERB): (बिखेरना): scatter**Synonyms:** spread, disperse**Antonyms:** gather**Example Sentence:**

The newspapers were strewn all over the floor.

8. ETHICS (NOUN): (नीति शास्त्र): morals**Synonyms:** morality, moral code**Antonyms:** corruption**Example Sentence:**

Ethics enter into every sphere of life.

9. PRESUMPTUOUS (ADJECTIVE):**(अभिमान): brazen****Synonyms:** overconfident, arrogant**Antonyms:** timid**Example Sentence:**

The man seemed too presumptuous to be a humble leader for the nation.

10. PRESUMPTIVE (ADJECTIVE):**(प्रकल्पित): conjectural****Synonyms:** speculative, tentative**Antonyms:** definitive**Example Sentence:**

The muzzle probably formed a snout in life; and there is presumptive evidence.
