2.ABROGATE (VERB): (अभिनिषेध करना): repudiate**Synonyms:** revoke, repeal**Antonyms:** institute**Example Sentence:**

3.HITHERTO (ADVERB): (अब तक): previously**Synonyms:** formerly, earlier**Antonyms:** afterward**Example Sentence:**

Hitherto part of French West Africa, Benin achieved independence in 1960.

4.ABDICATE (VERB): (मना करना): disown**Synonyms:** turn down, spurn**Antonyms:** accept**Example Sentence:**

He has always abdicated whenever given a responsibility.

5.GRAPPLE (VERB): (पकड़ना): seize**Synonyms:** grab, lay hold of**Antonyms:** let go of**Example Sentence:**

He grappled the young man around the throat.

6.DE FACTO (ADJECTIVE): (वास्तव में): in practice**Synonyms:** in effect, in fact**Antonyms:** in theory**Example Sentence:**

The country was de facto divided between two states.

7.TRIGGER (VERB): (प्रेरित करना): prompt**Synonyms:** stimulate, encourage**Antonyms:** discourage**Example Sentence:**
