<b>1. RESOLVE (NOUN): (संकल्प): determination</b>	<b>Antonyms:</b> plain
<b>Synonyms:</b> resolution, purpose	<b>Example Sentence:</b> His language was strangely ornate.
<b>Antonyms:</b> indecision	<b>8. OPULENT (ADJECTIVE): (धनी): wealthy</b>
<b>Example Sentence:</b> She received information that strengthened her resolve.	<b>Synonyms:</b> rich, affluent
<b>2. RETICENT (ADJECTIVE): (अल्पभाषी): reserved</b>	<b>Antonyms:</b> poor
<b>Synonyms:</b> withdrawn, introverted	<b>Example Sentence:</b> His tenants are quite opulent.
<b>Antonyms:</b> expansive	<b>9. UNBRIDLED (ADJECTIVE): (निरंकुश): unrestrained</b>
<b>Example Sentence:</b> She was extremely reticent about her personal affairs.	<b>Synonyms:</b> unconstrained, uncontrolled
<b>3. STRIFE (NOUN): (कलह): conflict</b>	<b>Antonyms:</b> restrained
<b>Synonyms:</b> friction, discord	<b>Example Sentence:</b> A dog should have an unbridled passion for food.
<b>Antonyms:</b> harmony, peace	<b>10. OVERTURN (VERB): (रद्द करना): cancel</b>
<b>Example Sentence:</b> With this civil strife the importance and prosperity of Louvain declined.	<b>Synonyms:</b> reverse, rescind
<b>4. OBLIVIOUS (ADJECTIVE): (अनभिज्ञ): unaware</b>	<b>Antonyms:</b> allow
<b>Synonyms:</b> unconscious, heedless	<b>Example Sentence:</b> The results completely overturned previous findings.
<b>Antonyms:</b> aware	
<b>Example Sentence:</b> She became absorbed, oblivious to the passage of time.	
<b>5. IMPROPRIETY (NOUN): (अनौचित्य): wrongdoing</b>	
<b>Synonyms:</b> misconduct, dishonesty	
<b>Antonyms:</b> propriety	
<b>Example Sentence:</b> She was scandalized at the impropriety of the question.	
<b>6. AMITY (NOUN): (मित्रता): friendship</b>	
<b>Synonyms:</b> friendliness, peace	
<b>Antonyms:</b> animosity	
<b>Example Sentence:</b> The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than amity.	
<b>7. ORNATE (ADJECTIVE): (अलंकृत): elaborate</b>	
<b>Synonyms:</b> over-elaborate, flowery
