

VOCABULARY FOR 16 MARCH 2024

1. MALICIOUS (ADJECTIVE):
(दुर्भावनापूर्ण): spiteful

Synonyms: malevolent, hostile

Antonyms: benevolent

Example Sentence: He was found guilty of malicious damage.

2. SUSCEPTIBLE (ADJECTIVE):
(सक्षम): capable of

Synonyms: allowing, permitting

Antonyms: incapable of

Example Sentence: The problem is not susceptible of a simple solution.

3. DESPERATE (ADJECTIVE):
(निराशाजनक): despairing

Synonyms: hopeless, anguished

Antonyms: cheerful

Example Sentence: The collapse of her business had made her desperate.

4. PROMPT (ADJECTIVE): (शीघ्र): quick

Synonyms: swift, rapid

Antonyms: slow, late

Example Sentence: She would have died but for the prompt action of two ambulance-men.

5. TYRANNY (NOUN):
(अत्याचार): despotism

Synonyms: absolutism, autocracy

Antonyms: democracy

Example Sentence: Refugees go through tyranny and oppression.

6. SPARK (VERB): (कारण होना): give rise to

Synonyms: cause, set in motion

Antonyms: bring to an end

Example Sentence: So many things concurred to spark the problem.

7. SIZEABLE (ADJECTIVE):
(ठोस): substantial

Synonyms: considerable, respectable

Antonyms: small

Example Sentence: A sizeable proportion of the population doesn't like late-night parties.

8. FUGITIVE (ADJECTIVE):
(क्षणभंगुर): fleeting

Synonyms: transient, transitory

Antonyms: permanent

Example Sentence: The light has fugitive effects.

9. DEFER (VERB): (मान जाना): yield

Synonyms: submit, give way

Antonyms: claim

Example Sentence: He deferred to Raj's superior knowledge.

10. WAIVE (VERB): (छोड़ देना): relinquish

Synonyms: renounce, give up

Antonyms: claim

Example Sentence: He will waive all rights to the money
