

VOCABULARY FOR 11 DECEMBER 2024

1. REPUDIATE (VERB): (अस्वीकार करना): reject
Synonyms: renounce, abandon
Antonyms: embrace
Example Sentence: She has repudiated policies associated with previous party leaders.
2. TEMPORAL (ADJECTIVE): (लौकिक): secular
Synonyms: non-spiritual, worldly
Antonyms: spiritual
Example Sentence: The Church did not imitate the secular rulers who thought only of temporal gain.
3. DISMAY (NOUN): (अचरज): alarm
Synonyms: shock, surprise
Antonyms: pleasure
Example Sentence: Much to the dismay of her fans, she announced her retirement very soon.
4. DISMAL (ADJECTIVE): (शोकयुक्त): gloomy
Synonyms: glum mournful
Antonyms: cheerful
Example Sentence: His dismal mood was not dispelled by finding the house empty.
5. DESICCATE (VERB): (सुखा देना): dried
Synonyms: dry, dehydrated
Antonyms: moist
Example Sentence: Both the old and the new vegetation were desiccated by months of relentless sun.
6. RELENTLESS (ADJECTIVE): (सतत): persistent
Synonyms: continuing, constant

Antonyms: short-lived
Example Sentence: We bore the relentless heat of the desert.
7. DISPEL (VERB): (दूर करना): banish
Synonyms: eliminate, dismiss
Antonyms: engender
Example Sentence: The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel my sadness.
8. MERITORIOUS (ADJECTIVE): (सराहनीय): praiseworthy
Synonyms: laudable commendable
Antonyms: worthless
Example Sentence: I got a medal for my meritorious conduct.
9. EXPLICATE (VERB): (समझाना): explain
Synonyms: clarify, spell out
Antonyms: obscure
Example Sentence: An attempt was made to explicate the relationship between crime and justice.
10. IGNOMINY (NOUN): (अपयश): shame
Synonyms: humiliation, embarrassment
Antonyms: honour
Example Sentence: He had to face ignominy due to his son.
