<b>2. OBSCURE (ADJECTIVE):</b> <b>(अस्पष्ट): Obscure</b>
<b>Synonyms:</b> Unclear, Dense
<b>Antonyms:</b> Limpid
<b>Example Sentence:</b> It was nothing but technical jargon that was opaque to her.
<b>3. ALARMING (ADJECTIVE):</b> <b>(भयप्रद): Worrying</b>

<b>5. EMACIATION (NOUN):</b> <b>(दुर्बलता): Thinness</b>

<b>6. COMPREHENSIVE (ADJECTIVE):</b> <b>(व्यापक): Inclusive</b>
<b>Synonyms:</b> All-inclusive, Complete

<b>7. PAINSTAKING (ADJECTIVE):</b> <b>(श्रमसाध्य): Careful</b>
