**1. REVITALIZE (VERB):** (पुनः जीवित करना): **reinvigorate**

**Synonyms:** re-energize, brace

**Antonyms:** depress

**Example Sentence:** A package of spending cuts has been introduced to revitalize the economy.

**2. DISSENSION (NOUN):** (कलह): **disagreement**

**Synonyms:** difference of opinion, dispute

**Antonyms:** agreement

**Example Sentence:** The issues caused bitter dissension in the party.

**3. EUPHEMISM (NOUN):** (प्रेयोक्ति): **substitute**

**Synonyms:** understatement, underplaying

**Antonyms:** dysphemism

**Example Sentence:** The jargon has given us 'downsizing' as a euphemism for cuts.

**4. HEDONISTIC (ADJECTIVE):** (सुखवादी): **self-indulgent**

**Synonyms:** indulgent, pleasure-seeking

**Antonyms:** ascetic

**Example Sentence:** He accepted bodily without farther questioning the hedonistic psychology.

**5. EPITOMIZE (VERB):** (संक्षिप्त करना): **summarize**

**Synonyms:** abstract, precis

**Antonyms:** elaborate

**Example Sentence:** For the benefit of our readers, we will epitomize the pamphlet.

**6. DEMOBILIZE (VERB):** (वियोजन करना): **disband**

**Synonyms:** decommission, discharge

**Antonyms:** conscript

**Example Sentence:** Both sides have agreed to demobilize 70% of their armies.

**7. DOGMA (NOUN):** (शिक्षण): **teaching**

**Synonyms:** belief, conviction

**Antonyms:** doubt

**Example Sentence:** In place of dogma, the elements of religion were alone to be taught.

**8. SORE (ADJECTIVE):** (पीड़ादायक): **painful**

**Synonyms:** hurting, hurt

**Antonyms:** healthy

**Example Sentence:** He couldn't speak as he had a sore throat.

**9. PANDEMONIUM (NOUN):** (हंगामा): **bedlam**

**Synonyms:** chaos, mayhem

**Antonyms:** silence

**Example Sentence:** There was complete pandemonium here.

**10. ASSUAGE (VERB):** (राहत देना): **relieve**

**Synonyms:** ease, alleviate

**Antonyms:** Aggravate

**Example Sentence:** The letter assuaged the fears of most members.
