<b>1-UNANIMOUS (ADJECTIVE):</b> (□□□□) : united
<b>Synonyms:</b> like-minded, at one
<b>Antonyms:</b> divided
<b>Example Sentence:</b> The doctors were unanimous in their diagnoses.
<b>2--Catastrophic(Adjective) :</b> □□□□□□□□ : Disastrous event
<b>Synonyms:</b> Calamitous , Cataclysmic
<b>Antonyms:</b> Fortunate , Blessed
<b>Example Sentence:</b> His mother's untimely death had a catastrophic effect on him.
<b>3--Deteriorating(Verb) :</b> □□□□□ □□□□ : To become wors
<b>Synonyms:</b> Collapse , Degenerate
<b>Antonyms:</b> Improvement , Heighten
<b>Example Sentence:</b> The weather conditions are deteriorating.
<b>4--Annexation(Noun) :</b> □□□□□-□□□ : To take what originally belonged to someone else.
<b>Synonyms:</b> Seizure , Invasion
<b>Antonyms:</b> Detachment , Loss
<b>Example Sentence:</b> Annexations of suburban territory in 1888 and 1890 greatly increased the area of the city.
<b>5-Amicably(Adverb) :</b> □□□□□□□□ □□ : Friendly in attitude
<b>Synonyms:</b> Assenting , Pleasantly
<b>Antonyms:</b> Unfriendly , Hostile
<b>Example Sentence:</b> We chatted amicably around the oak table, laughing at each other's stories.
<b>6-. Flagrant (Adjective):</b> shocking because of being so bad and so obvious
<b>Synonyms:</b> blatant, obvious, gross, egregious
<b>Antonyms:</b> underground, concealed, furtive

<b>Example Sentence:</b> After the basketball player committed a flagrant foul, he was kicked out of the game.
<b>7. Sordid (Noun):</b> □□□ : involving immoral or dishonorable actions and motives; morally wrong and shocking
<b>Synonyms:</b> filthy, dirty, dusty, muddy, stained, blackened, nasty
<b>Antonyms:</b> noble, upright, honorable, lofty, pure, respectable
<b>Example Sentence:</b> The movie described the sordid history of the mafia since 1950.
<b>8. Bizarre (Adjective):</b> □□□□□□□□ : very strange and unusual
<b>Synonyms:</b> absurd, insane, odd, crazy
<b>Antonyms:</b> reasonable, realistic, normal, usual
<b>Example Sentence:</b> Everyone stared at the student who wore the bizarre outfit to school.
<b>9. Trafficking (Verb) :</b> □□□□□□ : deal or trade in something illegal
<b>Synonyms:</b> trading, smuggling, selling
<b>Antonyms:</b> boycotting, blacking
<b>Example Sentence:</b> The abduction and trafficking of babies has been a problem in China for decades.
<b>10. Testimony (Noun):</b> □□□□□□ / □□□□□□ : a formal written or spoken statement, especially one given in a court of law
<b>Synonyms:</b> evidence, proof, witness, confirmation
<b>Antonyms:</b> rebuttal, refutation
<b>Example Sentence:</b> The defendant in court had to give a testimony about where they were the day before so they could prove they did not commit the crime.
